

# **UNISA SPORT CLUB MEMBERSHIP POLICY**

(Revised December 2023)

## 1. PURPOSE & BACKGROUND

Throughout 2013 UniSA Sport formally commenced the management of UniSA sport and recreation clubs previously aligned to the University of South Australia Student Association (formerly UniLife).

Upon initial hand over of sports clubs to UniSA Sport, it was identified that considerable variation in regards to club structure, governance and participation focus existed amongst the clubs impacting their ability to be affiliated with UniSA Sport under the initial club membership proposal. The key variation related to membership base, in particular those clubs that have a majority UniSA student membership compared to those that have a large UniSA alumni or community membership base.

As UniSA Sport is currently primarily financed through the Student Service Amenity Fees (SSAF) a number of restrictions are imposed on how this funding can be spent and therefore member clubs supported.

Upon the changeover to UniSA Sport there were a number of UniSA and external community clubs aligned to UniSA that did not have a majority student membership needed to be affiliated with UniSA Sport and supported via SSAF funding. It was however recognised by UniSA Sport that these clubs provide extremely valuable participation avenues for UniSA students that would otherwise not be available. UniSA Sport also recognised that this situation also extended to our larger, historical UniSA sports clubs such as Basketball and Hockey who compete in community/state leagues requiring extensive club management and player numbers. As these clubs have grown, so too has their alumni and community player base, which has effectively resulted in a reduced percentage of UniSA student members.

In a common trend, typically the clubs that do not have a majority UniSA student membership are aligned to sports that require a large and consistent player base and are competing in external community, amateur or state associations. The involvement in and commitment to these external associations requires a certain degree of club management, player commitment and player numbers, meaning a UniSA affiliated club with a majority student membership is often not viable.

As a result, recognising the valuable engagement and participation opportunities that these clubs provide to UniSA students along with the fact that these sports are not otherwise available to UniSA students via a majority student club, The UniSA Sport Club Membership Policy has been established based on an 'affiliated' and 'endorsed' club structure enabling these clubs to formalise and maintain membership with UniSA Sport without compromising the SSAF funding requirements.

The following sections of the policy outline this membership structure including the benefits available to clubs and their members as well as the terms and conditions required to be met by all affiliated or endorsed UniSA Sport club as of 2014.



### 2. CLUB MEMBERSHIP

The UniSA Sport Club Membership Policy splits clubs into two categories, 'affiliated' and 'endorsed.'

An affiliated club is one which has a minimum 10 senior members consisting of a majority UniSA student membership (51%). As an affiliated club they are recognised as a formal UniSA club and named accordingly with full access to the range of benefits available through UniSA Sport.

An endorsed club is one which also has a minimum 10 senior members however does not have a majority UniSA student membership base. The clubs senior membership must however consist of a minimum 10 UniSA students or account for a minimum 25% of the clubs senior membership. Endorsed clubs will also have access to a range of benefits through UniSA Sport however a number of these will be proportional to the percentage of UniSA student members. This membership category is predominantly aimed at community based clubs for sports whereby an 'affiliated' club does not exist ensuring a participation avenue is still provided for students while ensuring that SSAF funding is managed according to requirements.

The details below provide an overview of the benefits available and terms and conditions associated with both UniSA Sport 'affiliated' and 'endorsed' clubs from 2014 onwards.

### 2.1 BENEFITS

# 2.2 TERMS AND CONDITIONS

3. All students and non-students must be registered as Team UniSA members annually. Memberships will provide a maximum 13 months coverage from the 1 <sup>st</sup> March through until the 31 <sup>st</sup> March the following year. This structure will ensure those members playing traditional summer sports are not required to renew membership towards the end of their season.	3. #### \*Note:

- Clubs looking to gain endorsement but don't yet meet all requirements listed above may apply for an initial 12 month probation endorsement period, at the conclusion of which all requirements listed above must be met to maintain endorsement.
- No club delivering a sport currently offered by an affiliated UniSA sport club will be considered for endorsement.

### 3. INDIVIDUAL UNISA SPORT MEMBERSHIP AND BENEFITS:

All members of a UniSA Sport Affiliated or Endorsed Club agreeing to the terms and conditions outlined in section 2.2 must register as a Team UniSA member of UniSA Sport whether they are a student, staff, alumni or community member, to ensure the club receives the benefits itemised in section 2.1.

## **Membership Fees:**

- Current Students Free
- Non-Students (including Staff and Alumni) \$30 (inc GST)

## **Membership Benefits:**

- · Limited Personal Injury insurance
- Access to participate in a registered UniSA Sport Club & benefit from the associated club benefits e.g. venue access, grants etc.
- Access, support and subsidies to participate in UniSport Australia sanctioned events including the SA Challenge, UniSport Nationals and Championship events (current students only)
- Invitation and member price to the UniSA Sport Awards Night
- Newsletter subscription
- Access to further internal and external membership benefits to be established in the future.

To further enhance the Team UniSA membership benefits, numerous partnership agreements will be investigated to provide a range of member discount offers across Adelaide. While this process occurs UniSA Sport believes the price of \$30 is a fair representation of the benefits this brings to the individual and their affiliated or endorsed club.

# 4. SUMMARY

After extensive consultation with relevant clubs, UniSA Sport believes this policy provides a fair and workable structure to all clubs ensuring an ongoing membership can be maintained with UniSA and UniSA Sport while facilitating greater participation options for UniSA students across all sports.
